A GRATEFUL FAREWELL TO OUR PRESIDENT, DR. TIA T. MILLS

As July 14 approaches and LAE turns a new chapter, we pause to honor and celebrate the extraordinary leadership of our outgoing president, Dr. Tia T. Mills. After six years of dedicated service, she leaves behind a legacy of unwavering commitment, fearless advocacy, and heartfelt service to our members.

From the very start, Dr. Mills brought passion and purpose to every challenge faced. Whether navigating complex negotiations, championing workers' rights, or being a steady voice in times of uncertainty, she never wavered in the fight for fairness and dignity for Louisiana educators. Under her guidance, LAE has grown stronger, more unified, and more prepared for the road ahead.

Some of the milestones during Dr. Mills' presidency include:

- Defeated anti-labor bills.
- Advocated and assisted in the GPO and WEP repealed.
- Represented LAE on several community organization boards of directors.
- Mobilized members in the re-election of Governor John Bel Edwards.
- · Implemented the Community Schools Initiative .
- Established a support system for Hurricane Laura victims.
- Revived LAE's Republican Caucus.
- Bridged relationships with BESE Board Members.
- Increased diverse representation on the LAE Board of Directors.

- Advocated and successfully obtained adequate raises for Louisiana educators.
- Worked with Governor Edwards and Senator Fields to ensure educators received vaccinations.
- Partnered with Senator Fields in ensuring the mandatory age of kindergarten is five years old.
- Successfully advocated the passing of Senate Bill 128, which provides mandatory 45 minutes of uninterrupted planning for teachers.
- Successfully advocated the passing of Act 311, which ensures supplemental pay for supplemental work.
- Assisted with the implementation of the Future Voters Project, an initiative that registered over 100 high school seniors to vote.

Beyond the wins on paper, Dr. Mills' leadership has been deeply personal. She made it a priority to be accessible to members, to listen, and to lead with empathy. That human connection made all the difference and will be remembered just as much as the accomplishments. While Dr. Mills is stepping down from the role of LAE president, her influence will continue to be felt for years to come. She has laid a strong foundation and inspired a new generation of leaders who will carry the torch forward.


